Don Boyd

Don is Co-Director of the State and Local Government Finance Project at Rockefeller College, SUNY Albany, and a consultant, Open Source Policy Center.

- Under a project for the American Enterprise Institute, Boyd and colleagues Yimeng Yin and Gang Chen developed a microdata tax file for a single state (New York) that is compatible with TaxData and Tax-Calculator, and developed a "laboratory environment" that is useful for evaluating alternative methods of creating microdata files for a single state or for 50 states.
- Spoke before staff of the Connecticut state legislature on potential impacts of changing demographics on state tax structures.

Richard is a Senior Lecturer at the University of Chicago, Director, of the Open Source Economics Laboratory, and President of OpenRG. He is also a core maintainer of <u>OG-USA</u>, a macroeconomic model for fiscal policy analysis in the U.S.
