## Don Boyd

Don is Co-Director of the State and Local Government Finance Project at Rockefeller College, SUNY Albany, and a consultant, Open Source Policy Center.

- Updated and extended work on optimization routines to apportion microdata tax records to states and Congressional Districts.
- Completed final round of edits for <u>report</u> on Understanding the Impact of the Low Interest Rate Environment on the Retirement System, prepared with Yimeng Yin; to be released soon.
- Prepared draft report on public pension challenges and potential options for the city of San Jose, with Gang Chen and Yimeng Yin.
- Participated in roundtable on public pension accounting standards organized by the Governmental Accounting Standards Board (GASB).

## Jason DeBacker

Jason is an Associate Professor of economics at the University of South Carolina and a core maintainer of the open source models <u>Cost-of-Capital-Calculator</u>, <u>Tax-Calculator</u>, and <u>OG–USA</u>, which model business taxes and macroeconomic effects of tax policy, respectively.

Anderson is an economics PhD student at the University of Virginia and a core maintainer of the open source <u>TaxData</u>, <u>Tax-Calculator</u>, and <u>Tax-Brain</u> projects.

#### Max Ghenis

Max is President of the UBI Center and a core maintainer of the open source <u>microdf</u> project.
